- **Facilitated Content:** Traditional breakout sessions explore topics of common interest using innovative, thought-provoking content blended with audience participation. Presenters act as content leaders, presenting short segments of content and then lead engaging activities, group discussion and participant reflection segments on how to apply their new knowledge to practice.
- **Panel Discussion:** Includes 2 - 3 presenters who represent multiple institutions and/or perspectives on the same issue. Presenters create an engaging moderated discussion with dialogue, storytelling, case studies and lessons learned to help participants apply concepts. The use of a discussant/moderator is encouraged to structure the session and facilitate audience engagement.
- **Round-table/Conversation:** This session will include one to two experts with experience providing facilitation to serve as session host(s). The session's topic will be introduced by the hosts that may include a short presentation at the start, the majority of the session is dedicated to answering questions and fostering discussion, peer-learning and networking. Round-table sessions will be limited to 50 participants and be configured in a circle to encourage participation.
